

Sherlock Holmes is one of the most famous and popular detectives of all all time. It was in the Strand Magazine in which the original short stories of Arthur Conan Doyle were published. This volume contains the short story "Silver Blaze" set on Dartmoor. Perhaps more memorable than the stories themselves are the illustrations. These plain reproductions of Paget's original paintings illuminate the text. It is in the illustrations of this story that Sherlock Holmes' signature deerstalker hat makes its first appearance. The image of Holmes and Watson in a train facing each other (see catalogue front cover) is perhaps the most famous of all. The original artwork was last sold at Christie's in 2014 and is in a private collection. This is the biggest single draw of this binding up of six issues of the Strand. Unusual in such nice condition, this is a desirable volume for collectors and fans of Holmes alike.





[In Bleak House] "Dickens created Mr Bucket, who has been called the first fictional detective, and, it is generally accepted, was drawn from the mannerisms and appearance of a real detective-inspector, Charles Field" (Judith Flanders, The creation of the police and the rise of detective fiction, BL online). Amongst his various inverstigations, including the murder of Tulkinghorn.
